Tucson, Arizona June, 1969

Dearly Beloved in the Lord:

Thank you so much for your prayers and help for His Work. It is folks like you who help make possible the good work that our young folks are doing in winning young people to the Lord.

As you have heard by this time, we have moved our headquarters to Tucson due to the persecution in California and its coming judgments. The young folks there are now busily evangelizing the youth of Arizona with remarkable results, while seven teams are crossing the country evangelizing the youth of the nation. Already many have been won to the Lord and some have forsaken all to follow Him in youth evangelism with us. Arnie and Faith's team are already in Montreal, Canada, preparing our basic training camp which the Lord has provided for youth witnesses for the Summer. (If you'd like to send some young people, please let us know.) Two other teams are on their way to join them in Montreal, another team is working in Kentucky, another in Kansas, another in

Texas, the team in Arizona, and we are now crossing the South with our team. God willing, for the Summer we plan to converge on Miami, Washington, Philadelphia, New York, Ottawa and Montreal, the largest Eastern population centers of the two nations.

These teams have been boldly invading high school and college campuses with signs, public address systems and youthful music. Jonathan's group uses a band atop his sound wagon and has toured some campuses all day reaching thousands with the Gospel, attracting large crowds with phenomenal results. From engineering students to Black Militants, they have received the Word of the Lord and dropped everything to follow Jesus.

The challenge to be a Revolutionary disciple in the likeness of the early Christians has also been received by the youth groups of many churches as we endeavor to recruit more laborers for His Harvest, which truly is plenteous--particularly amongst youth today -- but the laborers are few. Wherever the young folks go -- on the streets, in the stores, and in recreational areas -- wherever they can find young people -- they are continually witnessing and winning souls daily. It is truly the most thrilling ministry we have ever had and the most fruitful -- and I might add, the most needed, for truly there has never been a generation of American young people so in need of the Gospel and so open to it! It is like the hunger usually found on foreign fields -- for Godless, atheistic, anti-Christ America has truly become a foreign field, particularly the youth, most of whom we have found have little or no knowledge of the Bible or His Salvation. This last generation is indeed a lost one, but the Good Shepherd is finding them one by one. Praise the Lord! Would that we had the time and the laborers to find them all!

Please pray for us. The task is so great and it is not without its hardships and persecutions. We travel as Jesus, sometimes having no place to lay our heads, and as Paul, having no certain dwelling place, but even our crowded campers are better than they had. Sometimes like the early Christians we are cast out of their synagogues, beaten, cursed, accused, imprisoned, and driven from city to city. "We are troubled on every side, yet not distressed; we are perplexed, but not in despair; persecuted, but not forsaken; cast down, but not destroyed; Always bearing about in the body the dying of the Lord Jesus, that the life also of Jesus might be made manifest in our body. For we which live are alway delivered unto death for Jesus' sake, that the life also of Jesus might be made manifest in our mortal flesh. So then death worketh in us, but life

in you. For which cause we faint not; but though our outward man perish, yet the inward man is renewed day by day. For our light affliction, which is but for a moment, worketh for us a far more exceeding and eternal weight of glory; For we know that, if our earthly house of this tabernacle were dissolved, we have a building of God, a house not made with hands, eternal in the heavens." II Corinthians 4:8-12, 16, 17, II Corinthians 5:1.
"For I think that God hath set forth us the apostles last, as it were appointed to death: for we are made a spectacle unto the world, and to angels, and to men. We are fools for Christ's sake, but ye are wise in Christ; we are weak, but ye are strong; ye are honorable, but we are despised. Even unto this present hour we both hunger, and thirst, and are naked, and are buffeted, and have no certain dwelling place; And labor, working with our own hands: being reviled, we bless; being persecuted, we suffer it: Being defamed, we entreat: we are made as the filth of the world, and are the offscouring of all things unto this day."
