

U.S. EXPEDITION WILL TRY TO FIND NOAH'S ARK UNDER ICE ON MT. ARARAT! By Roger Langley of National Enquirer magazine.

A scientific expedition to uncover the remains of what is believed to be Noah's ark, buried under hundreds of thousands of tons of ice on Mount Ararat in eastern Turkey, is scheduled to begin this spring. A ship-like outline imbedded in the ice on the mountain has been reported by several airplane pilots. Chunks of oak wood, reported to have been brought back from the mountain in 1955 & 1968, appear to have een shaped with tools. The 1955 wood specimens were estimated to be about 5,000

years old by experts in France, Spain & Egypt. It's expected to take two years to uncover the object. The Arctic Institute of North America, one of the World's foremost polar research organisation, will conduct the expedition. The Scientific Exploration & Research (SEARCH) Foundation will supply \$1.2 million to finance the project. An honorary vice-president of SEARCH is

H.L. Bont, a Texas millionaire.

"Finding Noah's Ark would, without question, be the greatest archaeological find in history", said James Lee, vice-president of SEARCH. "The stakes on this are so high that it would be negligent not to proceed & find out what it is that's on that mountain." Robert Faylor, director of the Artic Institute of North America, said: "We need objective appraisals to strengthen findings. I can't explain how wood that size & age could get to that height. Whatever is there is going to be of great archaeological interest."

Reports of Nosh's Ark being located on Mount Ararat have been made for centuries. The Bible, in Genesis, Chapter 8, Verse 5, says, "... The Ark came to rest on the mountains of Ararat." Marco Polo, who traveled through the area in about 1300, mentioned the existence of the Ark near the summit of Ararat. Frederic Parot, a Russian doctor, in 1829, climbed Mount Ararat & claimed he found ancient wooden remains. And in 1840, after an earthquake, Turkish authorities sent workers to the mountain to build barricades against avalanches. One group of workers reported seeing the prow of an ancient ship jutting from an ice pack.

In modern times, a French industrialist, Fernand Navarra, reported finding the Ark in 1937, while mountain climbing. He returned to the site in 1955 & brought back several pieces of wood, then wrote a book about the experience entitled, "I found Noah's Ark". About 12 years ago, the Turkish Army Signal Corps took an aerial

photograph which showed a ship-like outline on Mount Ararat.

"Commercial aviators flying over Ararat persist in reporting a ship-like shadow in the ice when it is clear of surface show a phenomenon also observed by Harry Crawford & Fernand Navarra on different occasions, "according to the preliminary report on the Mount Ararat Expedition prepared in February of this year by SEARCH. Grawford is director of field operations for the organisation. Navarra said he ound the Ark on the south side of the mountain, about 13,000 feet above sea level. He estimated the size to be about 450 feet long & about 90 feet wide at its broadest point. (Gen.6:15)

Navarra said he & his son, Raphael, then 11, who made the climb with him, found 150-foot long piece of timber sticking out of the ice pack & covered with pitch. he Bible records that Noah was told by God to cover the Ark completely with pitch. (Gen.6:14) Navarra said he cut off a five-foot piece which he then cut into smaller sieces to fit into his knapsack. The timber Navarra said he brought back appears to ave been squared off & shaped with tools
