Dear Dad, Maria, Rachel & Emanuele, 10 Feb. 78

God bless you all and greetings in Jesus' precious Name. It seems that in times like this it is often extremely difficult to really write you the kind of letter that will express

my heart's meaning.

It seems that in the last two years (as KQC's of Latin America) we've made so many mistakes, so many blow-its, just not being in tune, not hearing enough and not listening enough. I want you to know that I'm really, really sorry. Please forgive me for my part in some of these tremendous errors which have affected not only a few, but hundreds, even thousands of lives.

I have been guilty of so many gross errors, gross neglects, falling short, unspirituality, drinking too much, being ununified with Deborah, being too hard on the flock, it really freaks me out sometimes when I think about it. It's awful, disgusting! I didn't deserve to serve as a KOC.

I can't even begin to confess all the mistakes, blunders, faults and failings I've done in two years, it would take a book: freaking out

over our blob colony in Lima but not being able to do anything about it because of not being able to get together with Deborah, then overreacting in other areas and freaking others out because of my own frustration, etc. I've also been guilty of being the "big luxury leader" as you mention in "RNR" and not being careful enough with the finances, maybe sometimes as a retreat because of the problems or whatever. I was wrong, and by the grace of God I'm going to try to right it all. And may God help me to change and get back to Him and the basics.

We've been out witnessing and FF'ing almost every night for the last two weeks. I feel I've really failed in this in not getting out very much, and we're really trying harder. It's been such a blessing to get personally involved in people's lives and helping them to come closer to the Lord.

Reactions to the "RNR": You can't imagine how much I flipped out and how relieved I was and how happy I was when I read the Letter. I want you to know from the bottom of my heart that I think it is

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wonderful, fantastic and I couldn't agree more totally with every one of your suggestions in that Letter. As I just wrote in a note to Deborah: "I am thankful for these changes in the "RNR" Revolution, even if one of those changes is me." I want you to know that I want to cooperate and to help see them done in whatever manner I can be a blessing and a help.

Dear David & Maria, 22 Nov. 77

I love you so very much and want to thank you for your counsel and what you received from the Lord.
I hardly know how to express how I feel, expecially as I am still going through these changes and getting my spiritual eyes and heart back into focus, cleansed by the Word and faith restored and strengthened.

I hadn't realised that Josh had had that much influence on me and I am still seeing these things. After reading "Bewitched", I saw how things have happened to me. As Deborah was in the Letter, I too was "fascinated" with Josh, since coming back to the Pacific from visiting you, and it's something too I guess I have always done, since before he was my over-shepherd always. I have no excuse, I know, because of the time I was with you and all you had to share, but like Deb, I wasn't in tune with you and the checks you were giving and had given.

I've been seeing these things for a long time, but I haven't had the strength, faith and conviction to me and to really deal with the situation. I feel that I've also had a fear of man more than of the Lord. I have had in the past a real fear of Josh. I see I try to be too nice and friendly when you can't when it comes to disobedience and leader-

When I was reading the latest

all, I know I just fell back into being yielded to their spirit and I see
Caleb did too with Josh. Having
fear of man and of the law has influenced me instead of having faith
in the Lord and His Word. I was
more in tune with Josh's and Caleb's
spirit and the Law than the Lord's
Spirit upon my life.

LATIN AMERICA:

What FF'ing was like before the RNR'!

-A Report from Shaul & Abiah, KQS's of Latin America!

Dearest Dad & Maria, 4 Feb. 78
I just finished reading Deb and
Isaiah's report on her big Peruvian
fish, and I wanted to write my reactions and a few observations on
FF'ing in general in Latin America.

We ourselves, sad to say, did not have any real heavy FF experience in Latin America and can blame no one but ourselves, as we believe the counsel in the Letters is as plain as day, so that we and others like us are without excuse. Although a few things were done that discouraged FF'ing, it only proves to me that we were looking too much to man and his inspiration (or lack of it) rather than to the Lord and the

heavenly counsel already written down.

Many on the field waited on us, but the ones who did meet the most success were those who ventured out on their own, encouraged only by the Lord and His Letters. So Lord forgive us and those like us who didn't trust you and the Letters over our overseers enough to venture out. Even if it meant disapproval or losing a title, our obedience to the Letters must come first!

Deb's report, though showing that she is meeting some success in FF'ing, also shows a few examples of the type of spiritualising of the Letters and technique of FF'ing that we had previously mentioned.

I underlined in yellow on her report three simple examples that stuck out to me, to show how FFing has been treated in Latin America:

(1) Deb mentions about sex and manners: He's "not European...he's almost animal-like". But he sounds like most men I know, like in

"Male or Female".

(2) Isaiah says: "That's a mistake I think a lot of these girls are making, like Rosa" (Juan Carlos' wife) and Deb says, "Really making love with their bodies" (therefore saying they're using the flesh too much). It seems to me that they try to separate body from spirit, instead of seeing that men do have an almost uncontrollable hunger for sex and physical love and that when they know you love them enough to give them physical love, they trust that you also love their spirit and soul. So I believe that there is a tendency to spiritualise the physical side of FF'ing.

For instance, Isaiah said five or six times in my presence and others: "People have this fleshy idea of FF'ing, so let's not call it FF'ing.—Let's call it witnessing." But they don't see what an important part

stressed that the most important person was the fisherman. It seems to us that in most instances, the fisherman is scarcely needed until the fish is hooked, as you can't reel in a fish that isn't hooked on the line. Ruthie, Luis Manuel's wife, (Emanuele's Peruvian cousin) wrote Rachel yesterday about her first FF experience, where she chased a

fish to ask him to dance "without letting the fish see her ask her fisherman" (to be a bigger testimony). Ruth wrote: "We now see that was our mistake" (paraphrased).

When we were in Lima, Deborah and Isaiah would tell us to go to clubs but "don't worry if you don't meet anyone. Just relax, have a few drinks and go home." So even if people have been going to clubs in Peru, it's no wonder it hasn't borne a whole lot of fruit, as no one was encouraged to go after them.

(3) Isaiah says: "I think sometimes when we go out to try to FF, those are...like in our own works...we went out and met those people." In other words, don't go to clubs to get them, but make them come to you. This seems to us to typify the attitude about FF'ing. They give them flesh if it's some important official, but they don't go to the attack and meet them in clubs and love them, even if they aren't quite such big fish.

So overall, I think the attitude has been to emphasise the fish's spiritual need (which of course does exist) and de-emphasise their physical needs. Deb would emphasise over and over again how sex was "the absolute last resort" and bragged of how she got men interested without sex (prior to her first FF'ing in Ecuador) and how she had seen one fish three times and had gotten away with only kissing him once and nothing more. I agree that it's good to feed their spirits and that sex is a last resort, but over-emphasising it seems to be an unbalanced view of the subject.

When I first came here and Maria

visited me, I expected her to share something heavy and spiritual, but when we shared physical love, I knew not only that she was concerned about my spiritual needs but also my physical needs, and it was also a very spiritual experience, that heart-to-heart sharing without walls or barriers, that we had sorely missed in Latin America.

What Ebed and Leah shared about Deborah's FF'ing in Ecuador threw a lot of light on the situation. For instance, Deborah told us that all of these men flipped over her, whereas Ebed and Leah said that she hustled her way in and pushed the other girls out of the way in order to FF these big fish.

In Lima, Deb was quite upset with Rosa, Juan Carlos' wife, for not "stepping enough out of the way" with Rosa's fish, R., the son of a high government official, to enable Deb to hook him, although Rosa had met him and FF'ed him and he was very interested in her. He showed little interest in Deb, so Deb returned furious at Rosa for not pushing the fish on Deb, who showed little concern for what was best for R.

end and Leah stated she had only been interested in the big shots and each time pushed one of the girls out of the way to get them. Then they would talk about how "fleshy" Rosa and nearly all the other girls are. Even this report on her big fish seems aimed at pointing out how flipped he was over Deb rather than giving any insight into him, his character or needs.

We went to clubs with Deb and Isaiah three or four times. Mostly,

we danced together and little effort was made to meet men. Deb met one man, but I think he was the only man we really met in three or four nights between six of us (Zadok and Pal also). At one point, one girl met several single men in their 30's, but Deb and Isaiah thought she didn't know how to control him (he had had a little to drink) and therefore suggested she not go to clubs but be more or less restricted to ministering to friends, etc.

It's such a testimony of trust that you not only let the girls act on their own faith and leadings, but encourage them to step out and get on the attack. In Mexico, I went to a club several times with Zadok, but he also did little more than have a drink and talk. After an hour-anda-half, I went to the bar with Tekoa, our secretary, and we immediately met four hungry men. I went back to our table and dragged Katrina, the only remaining girl, back to the bar and we met three more men, leaving Zadok and Watchman to mostly talk and do little more.

So, even when people do go to clubs, they aren't being encouraged to really work at it, but it's treated as more of a "social event". There is a real lack of trust of the girls to follow their own leadings, and the fisherman's initial role is overemphasised.

Isaiah stated: "I don't see how single girls can FF", as their connection with the fisherman needed to be so strong. Deb and Jeth sent out an advisory suggesting that people FF, but stating something like: "But be sure to counsel with upperlevel leaders" (loosely paraphrased). So the overall effect, although their words said to FF, was to stifle

a real FF push.

They were at least trying, but I don't think they saw the adverse effect their "spiritual" view of FF'ing and going to clubs had. Here, the single girls and the girls without their mates make the initial strike and really go after them, and in an hour or two make more effect than we were making after three or four nights! Fisherwomen—what a bomb that's going to be!

Jeth had a meeting and told 20 people that their heads were in their pants and bawled them out (as I mentioned previously). Deb had an FF meeting and gave testimonies, but again made it all sound so spiritual that I think some wanted to avoid it for fear of not being spiri-

tual enough.

Personally, I believe most of our girls would do best just to be their own natural selves, concerned for each sheep that they meet. Rather than trying to work up the Spirit, they should just show them genuine love and a little bit of physical concern before putting out a big "spiritual love" rap, if you know what I mean! Deb tried to talk about things relating to the Spirit, and did well at this. But the flesh seemed just a tiny bit too removed.

To explain how it lacked that certain intimacy with fish that I've seen here, Isaiah announced in the big FF meeting: "Maybe the girls shouldn't do FF reports, but rather the fisherman should report on each fish." In other words, the girls weren't trusted with getting intimate with the men first, without the fisherman butting in. So the girls need to be given more leeway, more line.

Praise the Lord! I love you and love being here. We're learning so much, it's truly a great blessing to us. We have so much to learn and are thankful for the sample here!

One thing I really saw from the Letter is how fearful I've been about coming directly to you, how foolish to remain out in the cold rather than in the arms of David. We've been troubled about many things concerning the pioneer teams in the Mideast, Asia and Africa, most of whom we've personally visited or lived with. We wrote many letters and reports, sent phone messages, etc. about their situations and plights, sometimes extremely dangerous conditions, but with very little response or guidance, and occasionally only a chiding for the "low stats" on these very difficult fields. We were so frustrated at times we almost quit.

But now I feel sure that if we'd only had more faith and come to you with it first, our teams could have had more help and direction long ago. They really need it, we feel, and are so thrilled whenever you mention India or another area in a Letter! They suck on it for all it's worth! They love you and your message and gladly hazard their lives to bring it to these darkened lands! And God is leading and using them in new and exciting ways. May God help us to share it with you more faithfully! And they love to FF!!

Another point that really stood out is that need for visitation!

We've never felt so fulfilled as when visiting pioneer teams, some of whom hadn't had a visit in 6-8 months! They were so desperate just to counsel and pray with someone besides their local shepherds. Reading these new Letters, though, we see how we could have done so much more to help them! Thank God someone will be now! Another thing we are so thankful about is that we feel confident that when all the sheep from the pioneer fields write in and you personally get to see their needs and hearts, that the Lord will use you to help them more than ever with guidance and attention.

'RNR": We really wanted to tell you personally what a tremendous liberation the "RNR" has been to us as "leaders"! We know that the sheep were suffering, but I must say that the superblob tended to alienate "leaders" from the personal love we needed from our brothers and sisters! We were so afraid of getting "too familiar" and letting people see our faults, that we couldn't be real! What a blessing to be so freed! All the artificial relationships have been stripped away and we've been so much freer to enter into real ones! And it's great! We love this Family!

Your personal sample and lack of vanity and ability to let your true heart be seen by all is such a tremendous inspiration! Thank you and thank God! There must be 300 others just like us!—Flipped out to be free from ladder climbing, fear of failure and chains of pride!

We really love you, Dad and Maria! And we're praying for you! We

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pray that we can in some way be of help to this area. We definitely feel more at home in the Southern and Eastern fields than anywhere else!
