What is the verse you are memorising in John 15? "Every branch that abides not in him is cast forth as a branch". He cuts it, it withers and He throws it into the fire and it's burned. (John 15:4,5) In another place Paul says that every man's work shall be tried by fire of what sort it is. Every man's work must be made manifest whether it's wood, hay, stubble or whether it's gold, silver and precious stones. It says they are still saved, yet so as by fire. So when somebody escapes a fire, what do they have left? Just themselves. Everything else they had all burned down.

So that's what Deborah has now, all her works got burned up, so when she gets to heaven, what's she going to have? Do you think she's going to be proud of it? She's going to be ashamed. Some people at the resurrection are going to be raised to everlasting life and receive a crown of life, and some people are going to be raised to shame and everlasting contempt — that they're proven to have done bad, and people will think badly of them. Those people are going to be really ashamed of the way they lived their life and the way they disobeyed God and went their own way. So, Lord help us not to let that happen to us.

(Caleb: Did Uncle Aaron accept discipline? Yes, he did.)


Aaron really feared the Lord and he really wanted to serve Jesus and just be a witness. He didn't get on the trip of trying to be a big leader and being after a lot of power or money or material things. He endeavoured to memorise the Word and really stay in the Word and be a good example and to teach others and to be a shepherd



and a pastor and a witness, so he didn't get tripped off like Deborah did. Neither did Auntie Faithy.

Auntie Faithy has stayed faithful as a pioneer, living in rough situations and always out on the battlefield witnessing and pioneering new things for Jesus, pioneering new places and new ideas. She has stayed faithful to the Lord and the Mo Letters and to Dad and is still serving Jesus today and bringing forth good fruit.

Do you want to keep serving Jesus and helping other people to come to know the love of Jesus? It's up to you!



Jesus said, "You are in the World, but not of the World, but I have called you out of the World." He said, "Love not the World, neither the things that are in the World, for if any man love the World, the love of the Father is not in him." (John 15:19; 1 John 2:15) So we don't want to love the World, do we? If you love the World, it says, "Where a man's treasure is, there is his heart also." (Matt. 6:21) If you start seeking after the treasures of the World, your heart's going to go that way, and you'll become worldly — you'll become systemites.

It's an important lesson for you children to remember when we deal with you, when we spank you, when we correct you and deal with you about being rebellious and about not receiving correction, or not getting into the Word, or not having the right spirit when you witness and when you sing — because we know the dangers.

Out of our forefathers who have gone before us, some of their children have always rejected the Lord and turned out bad because they have rejected the truth, and have gone to be systemites — and we don't want that to happen to you! But it's possible if you don't receive the Word in your hearts and serve Jesus.

But let what happened to Deborah be a warning to you — because she was selfish and wanted material things and

money, and to be somebody important and she was bitter against her father, and didn't receive correction, and she turned out bad in the end. And her children are turning out bad too, just like Dad's sister who didn't like her Mother and was bitter against her Mother and the Lord, so she turned out bad, and her children turned out bad too, and got into drugs and every kind of problem you can think of. I know that if I were to become a systemite, that you would turn out bad, too. I certainly don't want that to happen to us.

But thank the Lord you had good training deep down. You had enough training when you were little and had the Word of God in your heart, you've always been with people who've been teaching you the Bible every day and taking you out witnessing your whole life.



So thank the Lord that you have had that good influence all your lives, and I hope and pray that by God's grace, all of you will turn out serving Jesus, just like I have turned out serving Jesus my whole life because of my father's good example. And Faithy turned out to serve Jesus her whole life, and Aaron also turned out to serve Jesus his whole life.

You can't think that just because you're in the Family that you're going to turn out good, and you're going to serve the Lord — or just because we teach you the Bible that you're going to turn out to follow Jesus. If you don't receive it in your heart, if you don't really follow Jesus yourself in your own heart, you could turn out like a systemite, or taking drugs, and all kinds of bad things. We have no guarantee that we won't turn bad just like other people have turned bad because they didn't continue to follow Jesus every day!

If you have bitterness and resentment in your heart, it's going to affect you. It's going to get you away from the Lord. It's going to destroy you in the end, just like I have seen it destroy members of my own family, my Uncles and Aunts and other people who didn't serve Jesus. They turned out worse than if they had been born in a family that wasn't Christian, that weren't preachers or missionaries for Jesus. They had the truth and they had the light and rejected it, and went against it — so they turned out much worse. They rebelled, and God let them go that way and suffer for it.

So that same thing could happen to you if you don't serve Jesus every day and have the Word of God in your heart,

and reject the lies of the Devil and the temptations of the Devil to get bitter and to murmur and complain. You've got to reject those things that come from the Enemy of not wanting to witness, and reject the temptations of the Enemy to want to be selfish and to want to live your own little life to yourself.

It's like in "The Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe": The young boy got all lifted up in pride and selfishness because he wanted to be somebody and be important. He was willing to betray



all of his family because he thought it was going to get him to be a king and be somebody important — when really the Enemy, the wicked witch of the Devil, was just deceiving him and getting him to betray all of his family. Then what did they do with him? Did they make him a king? Did the witch give him all the things she promised? No!

Do you think that the System is going to take care of Deborah and going to be nice to her and make her somebody important? As soon as they get everything they want, everything they can get from her betrayal of the Family, they're going to throw her away, just like they did with Judas. Judas betrayed Jesus to the scribes and pharisees, but then did they make him somebody important and take him in? Did they really trust him? No, they didn't want to know him after, they didn't care. They got what they wanted when they could crucify Jesus. So anytime you get anything from the System, it's going to cost you something.
