And not only that - they would send our stuff to their man here in Bangkok, thus getting it through customs for us! What a miracle - more than we could ever have dreamed of or hoped for! The Lord was just opening the doors wide for us to go through! In fact, one verse we got at the beginning when asking the Lord to help us get out, was Rev. 3:8, "See, I have set before thee an open door which no man can shut." What confirmations of this verse!

On Monday, the day before departure, we found we needed to bring a timer for darkroomwork. We phoned up our good contact at Philips, and he gladly gave us a brand new timer - the model so new it isn't even on the market yet - God bless him! "God loves a cheerful giver", and we know that God truly loves all our friends who gave so willingly and cheerfully!

They let us rent the house at a reduced price, without the usual deposit as well. And let us stay for 2 weeks free. TYJ! What a miracle! The Lord had given us the quote, "There's nothing too small for the Lord or too hard for Him. Every little thing! Why do you worry, why do you fret? God's going to take care of every little detail!" Plus over the next 3½ months Adam from Australia, Lek & Moay (Thai Nationals) and finally, Peter & Robyn & Ruth ½ from Australia, all came to help reap the harvest here. So now there are 9 of us plus 2 new local members, a student and a teacher, who can't live with us yet.

I would like to testify of how I got healed from hepatitis in 3 days!

HEPATITIS HAD BEEN GOING AROUND in a couple of homes, of which ours was one, so when I started having real-

ly bad diarrhoea and started feeling weak with a whirling feeling in my head, I knew it could very well be this that had started, but I kept rebuking it.

THAT EVENING AND NIGHT I WAS REALLY FEELING BAD and I remember, with a rising

Finally - the day of departure arrived! And it turned out we were not all travelling together anyway. So the rest of the Family followed 6 of us out to the airport. Here was the next hurdle: We were promised we would only pay 1.5 dollar pr.kg overweight, but now they said we should have been there early in the morning with the overweight-luggage (which we didn't know). So they said the official price was 18 dollars pr.kg overweight. So 18 dollars x 100kg overweight = 1.800 dollars! Whew! We sure didn't have that kind of money! So we prayed desperately while the Russians tried to figure it out. Finally they called their boss, whom we had talked to, and he said to give it to us for 1.5 dollars pr.kg overweight. The guy at their airport office came out to us and said, "I don't know what you did to him, but he said it was okay. Have a pleasant trip!" Hallelujah! So instead of 1.800 dollars we only paid 180 dollars! The Lord was sure helping us get out! "The king's heart is in the hand of the Lord, as the rivers of water: he turneth it whithersoever he will!" (Pr. 21:1) Then we had to board the plane, with A LOT of handluggage - 4 guitars, 3 small suitcases for paper, a small backpack, flightbags, 1 typewriter and 10 kg cheese - a donation from the Family in Norway. And it went just fine - though we were a bit cramped!

So - we were on our way! We were so excited! The trip took 18 hours - the flight itself took 13 hours, with a 3 hour stop in Moscow, 1 hour stop in Karachi, Pakistan and 1 hour in Bombay, India. Next stop - Bangkok!

There we encountered the last hurdle: Customs. On the plane Priscilla had asked the Lord specifically that the customofficers would not bother opening our suitcases - and they didn't - just looked at the passports and waved us through, PTL! With Peter, they wanted to see his newest suitcase, which only contained his personal clothes, and didn't bother with the old one - which acutally contained a whole darkroom! What miracles! The brethren were there to meet us, and now we are staying with Esli and Magdalena until we can find another house.

So - here we are, sweating it out! It is about 32-33°C in the shade, and very humid! But we love it, and are so thankful to be here - out of the cold warzones of the North!

Our vision here? - We would like to continue feeding the Danish sheep from here. It will not be on such a large scale as before, and so we'll also help reach the lost souls in Thailand. But - we'll have to stop here and tell you more in our next newsletter. - Lotsa love from up above - and down below where we all should go!
