nighttime way. Pixie woke up in the night, Alec brought her to me in bed (we trade off during the night—he picks her up; I put her back) and I settled her down for the feed. And then I promptly fell asleep again. This happens every so often that I fall asleep on the job, and the usual result is that eventually we'll both wake up again, some time later. At that time I put her back in her crib and she goes back to sleep on her own.

For the last week or so, however, the pattern has been slightly different, and when she goes back to her own bed she instead strikes up the band and won't let up till she's back on the breast. Hold out for the best, after all—who wouldn't? Well, last night I was just not in the mood for another long, drawn-out scene. I was tired, and I wanted to go back to sleep. The in-crib routine was not working, so I hauled her back in bed and cuddled her next to me, holding the pacifier in her mouth.

Pixie screamed. And screamed. And screamed. And I quaked inwardly. What to do? Every few seconds I promised myself that if she didn't stop in the next moment I would put her back on the breast. But still, somehow, I held out. And that was for two reasons: (1) I knew she wasn't hungry, as she'd just finished eating, and (2) I was right next to her so I knew she didn't feel unloved or forsaken. She was just howling about the downfall of her agenda, and that I could live with—barely.

She howled for five or ten full minutes—which at 4 AM is a *very* long

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time indeed—and all the while that troublesome little voice that we all know and hate was whispering in my ear: "She's going to be traumatized for life! She'll never be the same!" Yet the Lord's voice also came through to my heart. And so I held out, because deep down, I knew it was the best thing for both of us.

After a few minutes I could tell that she was working herself into a hysterical state—our Pixie is not one to give up easily, and by this point she had probably forgotten the reason she was even throwing the fit. So I sat up in bed with her, still holding her close to me, still holding the pacifier up to her mouth just in case she would stop screaming and want it, still whispering sweet words of love in her ear. I pointed to the little green light that showed that my computer had been left on overnight (oops!), and tried to distract her. After a minute or two, she abruptly stopped crying, and started sucking the pacifier.

I cradled her closer to me and kept talking to her, stroking her soft, fuzzy little head, and feeling like my heart would break for her. After another 5 or 10 minutes of recovering together, I got up and-rather gingerly, I'll admit-put her back into her bed, tucked her in, and went back to my bed. Her eyes were still wide open, but she didn't make a peep. She went right back to sleep on her own. When she awoke on her own again later, and again woke up after the feed when I put her in bed, the lesson held firm: She lay in her bed and quietly went back to sleep. Just like the good ol' days.

As for me, I went back to bed and tossed and turned for a while. Holding out like that is always very tiring for both my nerves and my spirit, and invariably I wind up feeling like a mean old ogre. But let's look at it realistically: My little daughter's will is doing just fine, and I know for a fact that throughout our entire ordeal she didn't feel alone or unloved. And if I can begin to teach her some of these very life-vital lessons now as opposed to in years to come when the habits are much deeper ingrained, then I'd say it's worth any self-berating and sleepless follow-up for me. And in the long run, I think we'll all sleep a little more sweetly.

have been confronted with incredible battles concerning staying CM or becoming FM, as I didn't seem to have a vision anymore. Then, your Letter came.

When we started to read, I thought, "This is the answer for me! I want to be FM. I just can't take being a hypocrite anymore because of my not living the Letters, not loving Jesus, not being in tune with the Lord as far as listening to Him and hearing from Him in prophecy." That was the outlet of steam for all the pressure that I had accumulated for months. On top of it, my wife and I didn't have a good

relationship as she could see that I was drifting away. Yet she could not make the choice for me.

A few days after reading S2K, I let my wife know that I wanted to become FM. She thought it would be a good idea for us to get together and see what everybody wanted to do. I was alone in wanting to become FM. I realized that I was not using the new weapons, as I was too ashamed, shy or proud to love Jesus. I was unconsciously fighting against the tide and the new ways, leaning to my old ways. He showed me sweetly that it was really easy to follow Him; I just had to humble myself and yield. I then started rereading the mailings, and was more and more comforted by the Lord that I could do it.

When the Lord said in the S2K Letter that it's okay to be FM and that it's another way of serving the Lord, one of the different concentric circles to serve Him within, and that the FMs are very much part of the Family, I think it encouraged people that were hanging on by their fingernails to have a break of full-time service, and they had the faith to find their level of service in the FM Family.

However in *Grapevine* #77 there's a CRO reaction talking about the three categories "hot, lukewarm and cold" implying that the CMs are (or should be) hot, the FMs lukewarm, and the ones that leave the Family are cold. He is right in that we as CMers should be "hot" disciples, and if not we might be better suited as FMs. However, there is a wide variety of FM Family members—some lukewarm, some cold, but some are hot. If Jesus and Mama say it's okay to find your level of faith, and that it's okay to be FM, then when people read this they may feel that there still is a stigma on being FM.

There's a family who wants to come back to CM membership, but first want to become FM and see if they can live up to that. They are on fire, love the Lord, and really want to do their best for Jesus. They are going according to their faith! They might not be as sacrificial as some of the CMs, but they are *not* lukewarm.

I feel that we can't judge or stigmatize people, as the Lord even loves the backslider and does everything to bring him back to Him. I'm learning that He's working in every one of His children. Only in Heaven will we really know. I d been re-reading the "Mama's love story" series lately and it's been very convicting, especially about the different lessons of love that you shared in there. I must admit that when I first read them I was more interested in the juicy details of your personal life, and didn't really apply the lessons to heart very much; however I've been going through some pretty heavy battles just over the last year or so about not being able to be in unity with another adult in the Home. To make a long story short:

Another family moved into our

single-family plus young people's Home some time ago. With all that the Lord was helping us to accomplish, I can now see why the Enemy's been so keen on dividing us through disunity.

We tried really hard in the beginning to live Acts 2:44,45, and to see the best in each other, but as the newness wore off and familiarity started to set in, the mother of this family and I had a hard time getting along. First, it was a difference of opinion regarding the disciplinary standard of the children, then the list of contentions started growing until neither of us could walk across the floor without one person finding fault with the other. We never put each other down outwardly or said ugly words about each other in front of others. thank God.

Disunity is a funny thing. It's like having bad body odor, you might think you can hide it pretty well, you might even get used to the smell and manage to tolerate it; others but have to get around you and are able to detect it right away. Ha!

We did have quite a few episodes behind closed doors where we tried to "work things out." Being a proud Aries, I wasn't about to be the first one to say sorry. After a few "trying to point the finger" sessions, we came to the conclusion that our differences were too great, we had nothing in common—our language, culture, upbringing, personality, even the color of our skin. (I can just imagine what Dad would have to say about that!) We came to the conclusion that we were going to tolerate each other and try to stay out of each other's way.

Fortunately, there is a happy ending to this unhappy story. I had been feeling convicted over the past couple months with the Letters that came out about loving your brethren, and then the recent S2K series, and had been praying desperately for the Lord to give us a fresh start. (God knows how many times I felt like a hypocrite trying to reach and love the world but not able to love my sister.)

Finally last week, the day after the signing of the S2K contract at devotions, we had an "appreciating each other" session. We'd focus on one person at a time and everyone would say what they thought about that person. It was very humiliating for most of us to sit there and listen to all these nice things being said about yourself, though also a major boost to your self esteem.

When it came my turn, I was pretty nervous. I wasn't sure if people were going to be able to find anything nice to say about me-considering what a rotter I'd been. But those sweet and loving words that came out of my brothers' and sisters' mouths changed my life. Some of the young people said things about me that I'd tried so hard to be for years, but never thought I could no matter how hard I tried. They said things like I was always there for them during the times that they most needed someone, that I never judged them no matter how bad they were, etc. (Of course, I felt like, "Is that you, John?") I know that if the things they said about me were true, it's got to be 100% the Lord. I know that I'm the opposite of those things-I'm as selfcentered, selfish, critical and judgmental as they come.

Something changed in me as those words were being uttered from their mouths. I was on the verge of tears and I decided that nothing mattered anymore but my love for the Lord and these ones sitting in the room with me, and that I'd gladly lay down my life for these dear ones. Even the sister I was at odds with said the sweetest and most sincere things about what she sees in me. It was an incredible experience—suddenly this veil that had been covering my eyes was lifted off, and I was able to see things in the spirit again.

After devotions, I felt the Lord's spirit again knocking on my heart's door, pushing me to take that first step to go and apologize and confess my faults and ask for forgiveness. She listened, then very sweetly apologized and said that she was also partly at fault, and we prayed together in humility for the first time in over a year and promised with the Lord's help to start afresh and leave the past behind. I walked out of that room feeling like a changed person, as if a giant load had just been lifted off my back. TYJ!

This was a super needed message, even though in our Home, due to an influx of new disciples, the Shake Up started about a year ago. Even for us it took awhile, back then, to see that the only way to keep these new disciples was for our whole Home to have a "back to the beginning" revolution. In the process, some voluntarily left, who couldn't do without the activities we had to cut off; others were asked to leave, or even were discouraged from coming over for visits, as we saw it didn't bear good fruit.

I can't say it didn't hurt sometimes, especially when I had to discourage my eldest son from visiting (he has just chosen to leave the Family for the time being), but I had to choose who to be loyal to, and whom to invest in. The Lord said to invest in our new disciples and younger children, and since we made that choice He has blessed us with greater unity, fruit and easier shepherding!

Our own senior teen does listen to System music (though not heavy rock) and is tempted by worldliness, but I feel his heart is right. He is a real blessing to us in many ways and he does love the Lord. We pray that with time and a lot of prayer he will find his place of service in the CM Family (he signed the provisional CM contract).

[Beware of selling on time]

Alito, Salomon and Kristy, Peru: We learned a very important lesson related to our financial situation. We had an enthusiastic perspective on the Christmas push and offered our tools to companies and some System distributors who offered us a good deal. It looked nice and easy so we started to order tools from the local PPC. Most of the tools were sold on credit, which means that we wouldn't receive money for several weeks. Well, weeks have passed and we still haven't seen the money, yet we have to pay the PPC for these tools. This is a big mistake that some of us made but now everybody is having to pay for it. It's a big lesson to learn: pray and ask the Lord about everything.

(<u>Editor</u>: However, selling to reliable or time-tested friends on time can be fruitful. The key is to ask the Lord before giving anything on credit or time payments.)

[Books and CDs]

Vida, Brazil: I have a big battle about things not being taken good care of. Some Family members don't have even the minimum of consideration for things.

My dad in the System taught me to take good care of books. When I went to the LIM, people there were very careful with books. I saw the whole process and stayed behind the scenes for about 10 years to help give the Family the precious Words of the Lord. Now that I'm on the field, I'm shocked at how people don't take care of books or teach their kids to. I see adults fold books open as if they were spiral bound! It hurts so much to see these precious books being handled this way, and it's not easy to get replacement copies of them either. We could never afford to buy them. We can barely come up with the money to buy schoolbooks for our kids.

The same thing happens with CDs. We get one copy per Home and in all the Homes I've been in, the CDs are all scratched up. At first I thought that it was the young people who didn't take good care of them, but I see adults leaving them on top of the table where they can get dusty, sometimes with the recorded side down. Now when a new one comes out I try to make a cassette copy right away from the CD but the sound isn't the same.

[How our case was won]

Simon and Julia, Poland: Recently we had some difficult days having to deal with officials, but thanks to the Lord everything is okay now. But there's one important factor that helped us to get a victory in our difficult situation.

We had to go to court to explain why we home school our daughter, Lidia. She's 10 and we've home schooled her for three years. The judge wasn't very friendly and didn't seem to want to understand why we don't send our daughter to public school. We explained that the reason for this was that we do CTP projects in a few different cities in Poland, so we teach her at home, for which we have legal permission from the school (which is very important to have).

The judge wanted to know how we support our large family, to which we explained that we are sponsored. She was not very receptive to all this and started to get on the subject of religion and cults. The Lord told us to stand on our conviction and explain what we can but also to stand on our rights guaranteed by the constitution, which states that we don't have to talk about our beliefs and we have a right to teach our children our beliefs.

She requested the addresses of the CTP places that we help and she wrote to them for confirmation on whether we really help them as we say we do. This was another very important factor to our victory—the answers from the places where we help. They wrote very positive letters to the judge about our CTP works, after which the judge had no more to say and had to close the case.

We've learned to have good contact with our CTP contacts. If they like you and are happy with your work and help, they may turn out to be a big blessing one day! They even give us some of their "provisioning" while we also help them. TTL!

[Letting your "kids" be teens]

David, Japan: I have been learning how to have a better relationship with our teens. As a teenager's parent, I'm learning to forsake the image of them as "kids." I've been treating my teens as kids, in the way I talk to them and correct them, etc. This may sound familiar to other parents who have teens. It's a little bit of a tricky relationship, though. In my mind, they are still my kids, but on the other hand, they need to be treated as adults to be able to develop more mature characters.

New projects and thanking donors

Two multinational oil companies have sponsored \$4,000. Three teacher training courses will be taking place in March and April totaling 29 days of training, benefiting 175 teachers, 6,000 students and a population of about 60,000 in rural areas surrounding the twin cities of Islamabad and Rawalpindi.

It is customary to do a report/evaluation of a project in the system, to present to donors. They contain a thank you, introduction, aim and results; long and short term results of the project, reports of follow-up visits and photo pages, all together about 20 pages.


We made a presentation/report books for two multinational companies who sponsored some of our educational projects. Although they didn't ask, we felt led to do so as it makes us more credible in their eyes when they see where their money went, and it also helped us to have something to show for other donors. It taught us how to present ourselves in a professional way. We asked a local friend who works in a multinational to evaluate our work.
